OUR WORK IS INFORMED BY PRINCIPLES OF DEEP RESPECT, HUMILITY AND INTEGRITY.

WE LISTEN NOT TELL

- We believe local people know the best solutions to their problems
- We ask people what help they need, not tell them what we think they need
- We consult and collaborate with community, developing shared goals
- We research, monitor and evaluate our work to ensure it is evidence-based

WE RESOURCE AND SUPPORT LOCAL EXCELLENCE

- We believe that support of the local economy is powerful development work
- We hire brilliant local staff, not foreign staff, and they are paid in keeping with the local economy
- We do not take overseas volunteers to project sites, unless skills are not available locally
- We do not disrupt or replicate existing government and local infrastructure or undermine government service delivery in the community
- We buy all products and services locally, only bringing goods and equipment from overseas if they are not available regionally
- We train and up-skill local people

WE AVOID DEPENDANCE

- We understand that the projects we work on do not belong to us, they belong to the community
- We minimise plaques, labeling and badging of projects in our name and in our donors' names
- We do not bring gifts or distribute money on project sites

• We are not afraid to admit to, and learn from, our mistakes

WE DELIVER INDEPENDENT AND BEST PRACTICE SERVICE

- We strive to ensure everything we do is in the best interest of the community
- We are not afraid to think and act contrary to prevailing opinion
- We do not take money from governments or give money to governments
- We share our experience and knowledge
- We are flexible and adaptive to new ideas
- We do not treat our projects as tourist destinations or places for people to learn or teach their children about the developing world and poverty
- We do not take our families and friends to project sites, other than as set out in the Adara staff manuals
- We induct all visitors to the cultural and political context before they arrive
- We manage visitors closely to ensure that they adhere to Adara's development principles and values

- We reach out to, support and seek to fulfill the human rights of the most marginalised and vulnerable people
- We support human rights through best practice service delivery

WE RESPECT HUMAN

- We have zero tolerance for discrimination in all forms, including based on gender, religion, political affiliation, colour, ethnicity, caste or sexual orientation
- We believe everyone has a right to health and education services no matter where they live
- We celebrate and promote diversity
- We respect, promote and protect children's and women's rights in our programmes
- We behave in a culturally appropriate manner at all times when on project site
- We are non-political and non-religious

WE BELIEVE IN PARTNERSHIP

- We have deep and connected relationships with the community, local NGOs and our donors
- We have a long term commitment to our projects

WE PRACTICE THE HIGHEST STANDARDS OF GOVERNANCE AND ACCOUNTABILITY

- We undertake rigorous internal risk management
- We believe in equal employment opportunities so we advertise all jobs and undertake a detailed and fair interview process to seek the best candidates for all positions
- We never pay bribes or engage with black markets or illegal economies
- We respect local, regional, national and international laws
- We hold ourselves and our partners absolutely accountable for actions undertaken
- We account for our spending to our stakeholders, and expect our partners to account for their spending to us
- We pay fair local market rates for services and products
