Amazing Assurance: Fiona Robens takes on Bermuda and Nepal with ISIS Secondment



Fiona Robens, a Senior Consultant in the PCS Assurance group, has been chosen as the PwC Ambassador to ISIS. This involves a 9 month secondment to ISIS and includes travel to ISIS project sites in Nepal and the office of other ISIS group companies in Bermuda. Here are her thoughts on the experience so far:

A question that I have considered over the last few months is "how do you define success?" My perception of "success" has changed dramatically over the years, even more so in the last 4 months. You can easily be caught in the trap of climbing the corporate ladder and become more accustomed to luxuries in life and not take time out to consider what really matters and what sort of an impact do you want to have on the world.

When I heard about ISIS I was absolutely amazed how two extremely successful women in the prime of their corporate lives could give up the opportunity to retire young and wealthy, to try and make a difference in the world. What a difference they have made! - Developing systems, policies and procedures for the companies within The ISIS Group.

It's been hard work, however when you see the huge impact that the work you do has on people's lives – it is extremely rewarding.

When I saw the opportunity to participate in this secondment program I felt proud to be an employee of PwC. It is amazing to think that PwC is willing to give up an employee for this length of time. This program has a huge impact on ISIS, as organisation in need of resources. It's also had a huge impact on me as the lucky Secondee who is having the experience of a life time!
